Texas State University System's financial reports available online

For the second year in a row, the Texas State University System has posted its *Combined Annual Financial Report* online for public inspection. The reports for FY 2005 and FY 2006 are available at the System's web site at <http://www.tsus.edu/about/publications.html>.

The information posted in the reports includes student enrollment data, net assets, and combined revenues and expenses for the nine component institutions of the Texas State University System.

"We've worked hard to keep tuition rates affordable at all of the System's institutions, as well as keep the System overhead costs down," said Chancellor Charles R. Matthews.

These annual reports comply with Tex. Gov't Code Ann §2101.011 and fulfill requirements established by the Comptroller of Public Accounts. They are part of the overall audit of the State of Texas Comprehensive Annual Financial Report and are subject to audit by the State Auditor.

"The Texas State University System and its component institutions have made a tradition of exercising good stewardship of tax payer monies," said Dr. Roland K. Smith, Vice Chancellor for Finance. "We take this responsibility very seriously."

The Texas State University System Board of Regents approved a \$750 million budget for the 2007 fiscal year. That financial report will be available online in November.

The Texas State University System is the oldest multi-campus system in Texas and plays a critical role in the educational and economic development of this state. It is governed by a nine member Board of Regents appointed by the Governor. In addition, a nonvoting student regent is appointed annually to the Board.

TSUS's nine component institutions are committed to serving the people of Texas through education. The Texas State University System Institutions include: Angelo State University; Lamar Institute of Technology; Lamar State College-Orange; Lamar State College-Port Arthur; Lamar University; Sam Houston State University; Sul Ross State University; Sul Ross State University Rio Grande College; and Texas State University-San Marcos.
